Four Arlene Breeden Cultural Arts Scholarships are being offered by WICPTSA again this year – two at Rogers School and two at Iroquois School. Ms. Breeden was an inspiring art teacher for many years at Iroquois School; these scholarships were established in 1973 to remember and honor her. Since 1981, two scholarships have been awarded at both Iroquois and Rogers Schools. Each scholarship is for a maximum of \$100 to be used towards a summer cultural arts program of the student's choosing.

A wide variety of programs fulfill the 'cultural arts' requirement, including (but not limited to) music, dance, drama, painting, drawing, photography, weaving, jewelry, or ceramics. Many local institutions offer an extensive variety of summer programs, and the PTSA wishes to encourage students to take advantage of such opportunities for enrichment.
